Welcome to the Randolph Ski Club!

Of Intervale, NH

The Randolph Ski Club (RSC) was originally founded in 1966 as a non-profit ski club by a group of skiers from Randolph, MA. Although our present membership is composed of people from all over the Greater Boston area, we have traditionally kept the original name of the club.

Our refurbished farmhouse, with an attached and finished barn, includes a large fully equipped kitchen, living room, six bathrooms, and seven dormitory style bedrooms; three for the men and four for the women. The first floor of the renovated barn serves as a media room and is mainly used for socials and club dining. The second floor is our loft that serves as dormitory style overflow/co-ed sleeping quarters.

The house is located on Intervale Crossroad just outside North Conway. There are cross-country ski trails behind the lodge and we are minutes to major ski areas, hiking, mountain biking, canoeing, golfing and shopping. The house is utilized year round by its members who take advantage of all these great opportunities.

Each member of the Randolph Ski Club is also a member in the Eastern Inter Club Ski League (EICSL). There are approximately 26 other clubs in this league many of which are located in the Mt. Washington Valley area. EICSL organizes a racing program among the ski clubs, coordinates social events, and provides discounts on merchandise, services and lift

tickets. The League also publishes the "Lift Lines", which is mailed to each member twice a ski season and provides news, information and related advertising on the activities of all the ski clubs as well as the League itself.

The RSC is active throughout the year, involving itself in planned activities for every season. Randolphians ski, hike, golf, canoe/kayak and spend some weekends just hanging out. North Conway is a beautiful area year round.

During ski season, there is an organized calendar of socials for the ski clubs and their guests. Each house has a "traditional" social date and theme. "The Dating Game" which is held the Saturday afternoon of President's weekend is the traditional annual event at the RSC. This weekend begins with "skip day" when RSC members take Friday off for skiing and enjoying each other's company. Our other winter social is generally the Saturday of MLK weekend.

Social occasions are not limited to the ski season. The RSC holds an annual Canoe / Clambake weekend in mid-summer at the house. This is a fun weekend featuring canoeing during the day, a catered clambake for dinner and we finish the day with socializing in the barn.

A Family Weekend follows both the Dating Game and the Canoe/Clam Bake weekends when we welcome club members and friends with younger family members to enjoy the house. Other great weekends up north include New Years Eve, an end of ski season get-together event, a welcome to Spring event in April and Autumns Fiddler's Green Weekend on Columbus Day Weekend. Despite all these

activities, there are still "off weekends" at the house if you just want a quiet weekend away!

Guests are always welcome at the house accompanied by a member of the club. Guest fees are \$20.00 each night. If you are interested in staying at the house as a guest, contact the club's membership representative listed at the end of this brochure.

To become a member of the Randolph Ski Club, a prospective applicant must be single and at least 21 years of age. He/she must submit an application form with a twenty-five dollar (\$25.00) application fee (not applicable to the annual dues) to the membership representative. After attending at least one general club meeting, as well as lodging two or more weekends at the club, the applicant will then be voted on by the club membership.

Currently, membership is \$350.00 per year with no additional lodging fees. So, come on up to the Randolph Ski Club in the White Mountains of NH and start enjoying how life can be.
